Ship description:	Built by Wm. Beardmore & Co., Glasgow, Scotland. Tonnage: 18,357. Dimensions: 571' x 72' (600' o.l.). Quadruple-screw, 19 1/2 knots. Steam turbines. Two masts and two funnels.
History:	Passengers: 287 first, 505 second, 848 third. First voyage as Empress of France Liverpool to Quebec, November 14, 1919. Made a world cruise from New York in 1923. Placed in trans-Pacific service in December 1928 for a year. Last voyage: Southampton-Quebec, October 2, 1931. Laid up until scrapped in 1935. Ex-Alsatian (1919).
